

Creole General P.G.T. Beauregard with Sean Michael Chick

Few Civil War Generals attracted as much debate and controversy as Pierre Gustav Toutant Beauregard. combined brilliance and charisma with arrogance and histrionics. He was a Catholic Creole in a society dominated by white Protestants, which made him appear exotic next to the likes of Albert Sidney Johnston and Robert E. Lee He was reviled by Jefferson Davis and often mocked by Mary Chesnut in her diary. Yet, he was popular with his soldiers and subordinates. Outside of Lee. he the South's was most consistently successful army commander. Yet, he lived his life in the shadow of his one major defeat: Shiloh. After the war he was a successful railroad executive and took a stand

against racism, violence, and corruption during Reconstruction. Yet, he was ousted from both railroads he oversaw and his foray into reconstruction politics came to naught. His was a life of contradictions and dreams unrealized.

Adam F. Miller, Who Carved His Initials on the Jennie Wade House, Finishes the Job After Forty-Four Years

In Gettysburg, located next to the gutter pipe on the left, front of the Jennie Wade house, Private Miller carved initials were placed there on the first day of the battle on July in 1863. His regimental number and company letter was placed there later in 1907. The following is a newspaper account:

"Adam F. Miller of Berwyn, PA, a member of Company I, 75th PA Regiment, was here last week at the Unions Veterans' Legion Encampment. Mr Miller, a member of the Union League, was also here 44 years ago and participated in the great conflict.

He fought in the first day's battle, and while passing through the town in the evening stopped in the rear of the Jennie Wade House, from which place some heavy firing was done. It became "too hot" for Mr. Miller and is fellow soldiers and they hastened to Cemetery Hill, where they spent the night. Early next morning Mr. Miller obtained



permission from his first lieutenant to go back to the Wade house, and on the south side placed his initials, with the use of his bayonet.



Last week he went to the house to see if his initials were still visible on the brick. He found them there and told the story to Mrs. R.C. Miller and asked her permission to place his company and regiment to the name which was granted. Mr Miller wore a star [11th Corp Badge], bearing the inscription of his company and regiment which was worn on his cap during the Battle of Gettysburg." - Adams County Independent, Littlestown, PA September 21, 1907.

Adam F. Miller was born in Hanover, Germany, originally enlisted under his middle name being known as Francis Miller, when joining his regiment on Nov

28th 1861 in Philadelphia. He enrolled as a private in Co I, 75th Pennsylvania Infantry but later deserted April 6, 1864. He returned to his company Aug 8, 1864 and was mustered out as a corporal on July 16, 1865.

The 75th PA was originally known as the 40th, composed principally of German Citizens from Philadelphia. Many of the member had seen military service in the European armies. Originally part of the



Army of the Potomac, serving in the 11th corp, 3rd division, the regiment was transferred with the entire 11th Corp to the Army of the Ohio and Cumberland after Gettysburg.

Corporal Miller was employed as a painter and paper hanger after the war. He died at the age of 83 in Maple Shade, NJ on Jan 10 1928 and is buried at Union Hill Cemetery, Kennett Square, Chester Co, PA.
